Welcome to the Halkirk District Benefit Fund (HDBF) Newsletter. For those of you not familiar with HDBF, the company was set up in 2004 and funding is provided by Npower Renewables who own the windfarm at Causeymire. The aim of our newsletter is to get our message to more people and make the community aware that funding is available for constituted groups and individuals within the community who wish to apply to become a member. (either as an individual or constituted group). To qualify you must live within the Halkirk District Community Council boundary, (this includes Altnabreac, Banniskirk, Calder, Georgemas, Harpsdale, Spittal, Mybster and Westerdale). Applicants should be registered on the electoral roll for the area and complete the appropriate application form which is available at Halkirk Post Office.

The decision of how funding should be used and distributed is made by the HDBF Directors who meet approximately ten times a year. The current Chairperson is Mr Douglas Munro and the Treasurer is Mr Norman Fraser. Other Directors are Mrs Gillian Coghill, Mr David Busby Mr David Sutherland, Mr Christie Cameron and Mr David Eyers. Over the past years many groups and individuals have benefited from funding from HBDF. Over the past financial year, more individuals and groups than ever before have

received funding from HDBF. With that in mind, it was very disappointing at our recent AGM that out of 165 individual members and 29 Group Members, only the Directors plus 13 members attended. The AGM is your chance to see how the Fund is working and to have your say and ask questions. Thanks to three very recently appointed Directors we currently have our full complement of seven, but as Directors may only serve for six years, two will have to stand down in 2015 so attendance at our AGM in 2014 is crucial and hopefully more of you will be happy to take an active part.

As a "one off" this Newsletter is being sent to every member by post as well as being placed in the Post Office, shop and Doctors' surgery.
